Specific Project Goals and Measurable Outcomes

The primary goal of this funding request is to continue supporting the Paradise Valley Weed District (PVWD) in their efforts to control and eradicate medusahead grass (*Taeniatherum caput-medusae*) in the Humboldt County area surrounding the town of Paradise Valley. Medusahead has been labeled as "public enemy #1" by the Nevada Department of Agriculture. Medusahead is an invasive annual grass that has potential to be far worse for Nevada and the Great Basin wildlife habitat than cheatgrass and medusahead is beginning to be found in various locations throughout northern Washoe and Humboldt Counties. Medusahead has little or no forage value for wildlife of livestock and is extremely difficult to control. The PVWD has mobilized efforts on BLM, USFS and private lands and the PVWD is working actively to use a variety of means to control and monitor medusahead.

This \$9000.00 in Dream Tag funding would be used to purchase chemicals to treat medusahead grass on private land within Paradise Valley in Humboldt County, Nevada.

Project Location

The Paradise Valley Medusahead projects are located in and around the town of Paradise Valley, Nevada in Humboldt County. Project Description




Figure 1. Map of Paradise Valley medusahead treatment projects.

Figure 1 depicts Paradise Valley in Humboldt County, Nevada. The project sites where this funding would be utilized are within the various private land parcels shown across the medusahead populations. The private lands are interspersed within BLM and USFS managed lands and these federal lands are being treated as well making this Dream Tag request part of a larger treatment area.

Principals Involved

Daryl Riersgard (Coordinator of Paradise Valley Weed District), Lee Turner (NDOW and NPCD), Boyd Hatch (Santa Rosa USFS), Rob Burton (Winnemucca BLM), Dave Cassinelli (Private Landowner) are the primary leads for the habitat work in Paradise Valley for the medusahead control efforts.

Permitting

The work that this funding would support is being performed on private lands. The nature of the treatments does not require any National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) or State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) analyses. All Paradise Valley landowners have been consulted and most are actively and enthusiastically participating in the medusahead treatment efforts.

Future Phases

Treatment of medusahead is likely to be an ongoing effort. This invasive species is beginning to be found in much of NW Nevada and without continued mapping and aggressive treatment, it will be a major problem. The PVWD will be working into the foreseeable future. The funding in this Dream Tag request will be used upon receipt to purchase additional weed treatment chemicals.

Time Line

- Medusahead infestations mapped beginning in 2010 and ongoing
- Initial funding sources secured and verified in 2010 via the PVWD
- Spraying with Impazapic (various brand names depending upon manufacturer) begun in 2010
- Reports prepared to document treatment and monitoring efforts prepared in 2010, 2011 and 2012
- Ongoing weed treatments continue to present and will continue until meaningful control is accomplished
- Fires within the project sites may alter scheduled activities but as of August 18, 2012 no private land parcels within the scope of this proposal had been impacted by fire

Success and Measuring Results

The PVWD is an active group that performs regular monitoring for medusahead and other weeds across Paradise Valley on a bi-weekly basis. The group maps and documents all weed treatments and any follow up efforts to plant desirable species. Weed inventorying will continue to take place in the project area and on land adjacent to the project area. Any identified medusahead populations will be sprayed on the private land with the proper herbicide through coordination with PVWD. Weeds found on BLM and USFS administered land will also be treated and reported through a current agreement between PVWD and BLM and USFS. Success will be measured in terms of acres of medusahead treated and cover/abundance of medusahead reduced.

Staff Positions

The Paradise Valley Weed District has a coordinator who is a part-time staff. This medusahead treatment effort is the PVWD's highest priority and as such is the coordinator's full time job.

Volunteers Involved

Local Paradise Valley resident volunteers have been used to date to help determine medusahead population locations. The majority of the weed treatments performed on the private land within the PVWD is done by volunteer members of the PVWD. Most often the individual landowner works with the PVWD to arrange treatments. Work on the USFS and BLM lands have not used volunteers to date.

Grant Match

Grant Amount Provided: \$205,000

Match details:

This Dream Tag proposal is not intended to be the primary source of funding for the Paradise Valley Medusahead Control project. The total match budget of secured funding (including in-kind) is

\$205,000.00 and budget detail is provided. The Dream Tag requirement of at least 25% match has been met and exceeded. The Dream Tag request is being made to allow for the overall effectiveness and collaborative nature of the project to be expanded.

For most habitat projects, numerous funding sources are necessary and each source applied for has a match requirement. Obtaining the \$9,000.00 requested here will allow leveraging of an additional \$27,000.00 in federal funds. This additional \$36,000.00 will be used to affect meaningful treatments across Paradise Valley.
